

Opening note:

Few years ago, a team from the Environment Agency – Abu Dhabi inaugurated research, surveys, and analysis to examine the effect of single use plastic products on the marine environment.

Local and international studies listed the following 16 marine litter abundant in the beaches and marine environment:

Plastic bags, cups and lids, cutlery, plates, straws, stirrers, food containers, plastic bottles, cotton buds, crisp packets, sweet wrappers, cigarette butts, wet wipes and sanitary items, sticks for balloons, balloons, and microbeads (including nurdles).

11 billion plastic bags are used in the UAE, which is equivalent to around 1,182 bags used yearly/per person.

More than 600 species have been listed endangered due to this issue.

In line with the efforts to cut down the use of the listed products, Environment Agency – Abu Dhabi released Single use plastic policy banning oxo - degradable single use plastic bags less 50 micons, introducing fees to some of the listed products, takeout items including (cutlery, wet wipes, wrappers...etc)

Addressing Critical Environmental Issues using UAE's resources

United Arab Emirates students and faculty develop cutlery that can be replaced by single use plastic cutlery.

Noran Mousa and Sabeera Haris, PhD scholars at the University's College of Engineering; Emmanuel Galiwango, PhD graduate; under the supervision of Prof. Ali Al-Marzouqi and Prof. Basim Abu-Jdayil in the Department of Chemical and Petroleum Engineering, and industrial partner, Yousuf L. Caires. from United Arab Emirates University develop innovative solution replacing single use plastic items to biodegradable organic cutlery from the 40 million date palm trees spread across the UAE.

The students said:,"We thought about the dangerous problem we are facing relating to using single use plastics because they take thousands of years to

degrade and they are dumped in the ocean".

They added: "They are the main source of air and soil pollution, so we wanted to produce biodegradable and green cutlery."

The product was made with continuous sideline support to find optimal formulation of sustainable cutlery. With continuous tests, the team was able to successfully produce Palmade forks, knives, spoons and stirrers by grinding date palm leaves and mixing them with polylactic acid, before developing the biodegradable cutlery aiming to replace single use plastics.
